3.6.10.2 The requirement in regulation 10.5.2.2.2 with respect to foam fire extinguishers of at least 45 L capacity each or equivalent does not apply in respect of a vessel that is not a Safety Convention vessel, is of less than 500 gross tonnage and is engaged on a sheltered waters voyage or a near coastal voyage, Class 2.

SOLAS Chapter II-2, Regulation 10.10.4 Fire Fighter ...

Chapter II-2: Construction - Fire protection, fire detection and fire extinction. Since fire is a major safety hazard on board, vessel construction includes methods on how to prevent fire, detecting them and their extinguishing systems. Chapter 2-2 contains 5 Parts and 23 regulations. Examples of fire safety provisions include the following:

SOLAS Convention of 1974: Chapters and Regulations in Summary

Amendments to SOLAS regulation II-2/3.56, relating to the definition of “vehicle carrier” and adoption of new SOLAS regulation II-2/20.2 on fire safety requirements for cargo spaces containing vehicles with fuel in their tanks for their own propulsion, specifically vehicles which do not use their own propulsion within the cargo space.

SOLAS amendments entering into force 1 January 2020

SOLAS regulation II-2/10.10.4 amended by IMO resolution MSC.338(91) requires: “For ships constructed on or after 1 July 2014, a minimum of two two-way portable radiotelephone apparatus for each fire party for fire-fighter’s communication shall be carried on board. Those two-way portable radiotelephone apparatus shall be of an explosion-proof type or intrinsically safe.

SOLAS (Safety of Life at Sea) new or upcoming requirements ...

Chapter II-2 of SOLAS 1974, which applies to ships constructed on or after 1 January 2003. A ship shall be considered to meet the functional requirements set out in paragraph .2 and to achieve the fire safety objectives set out in paragraph .1 when either: .1 the ship’s designs and arrangements, as a whole, comply
