The Victorian Railways (VR), trading from 1974 as VicRail, was the state-owned operator of most rail transport in the Australian state of Victoria from 1859 to 1983. The first railways in Victoria were private companies, but when these companies failed or defaulted, the Victorian Railways was established to take over their operations.

Rail transport in Victoria, Australia, is provided by a number of railway operators who operate over the government-owned railway lines. The network consists of Victorian broad gauge (1,600 mm (5 ft 3 in)) lines, and an increasing number of standard gauge (1,435 mm (4 ft 8 1/2 in)) freight and interstate lines; the latter brought into existence as a result of gauge conversion of the former.
